Blackpool Tower

The Blackpool Tower, inspired by the Eiffel Tower in Paris, was opened to the public in 1894. It includes a circus, ballroom and roof gardens too. The ballroom was designed by a Victorian architect (Frank Matcham) and is still used for social dances and competitions today.



Royal Albert Dock, Liverpool

A group of dock buildings and warehouses, this area was opened in 1846. It was the first warehouse system in the world that was fireproof and secure. Being so important to global trade in the UK, it was a target for enemy bombers during the Second World War.



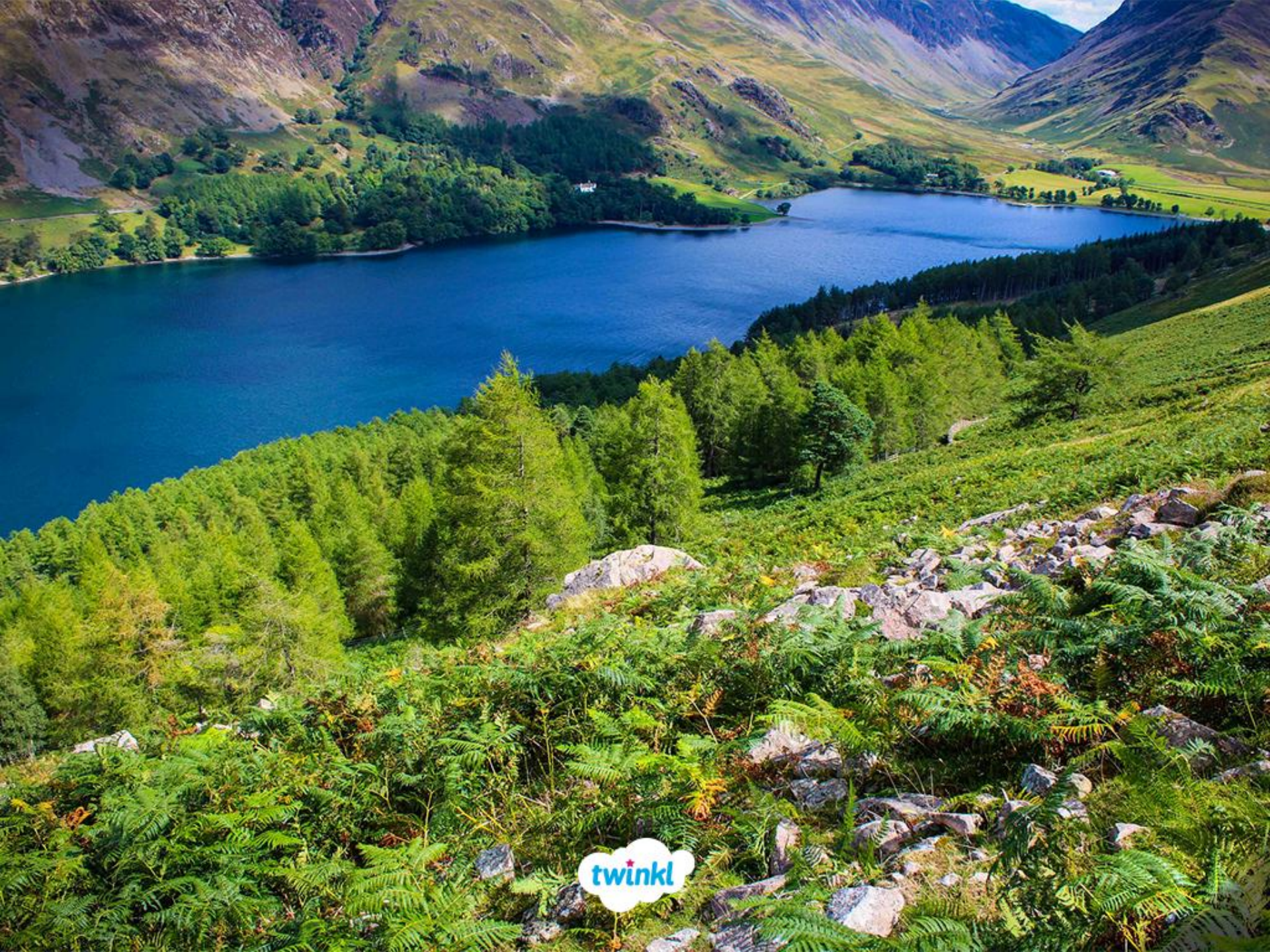
Chester City Walls

The oldest, longest and most complete city walls in Britain, Chester still has a full circuit of ancient defensive walls that you can explore. The Romans began construction between AD 70 and 80, which means parts of the walls are almost 2,000 years old!
